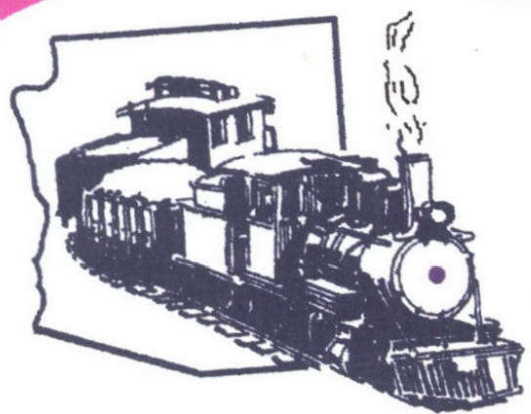
PHOENIX ABTO BUS TOUR

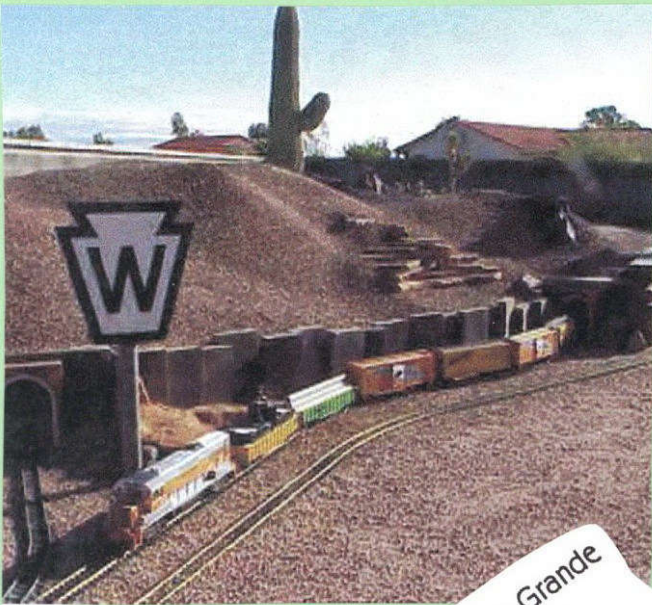

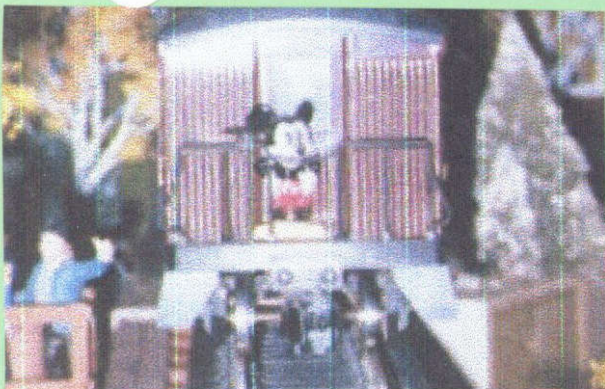

Come along with Mickey for a ride on the Denver and Rio Grande Narrow Gauge Railroad between Chama and Cumbres in the 1930s. Then step outside to play train-tag with battery powered (24 volts, 15 amps) Union Pacific Locomotives by Aristo-Craft and U.S.A.

You don't have to worry about the polarity of the track because the trains are battery powered. You must keep a watchful eye out for head-on collisions while trains traverse between the double track main line, through the tunnels, over bridges and back into the garage then past the railroad yard and outside through the round-abouts.

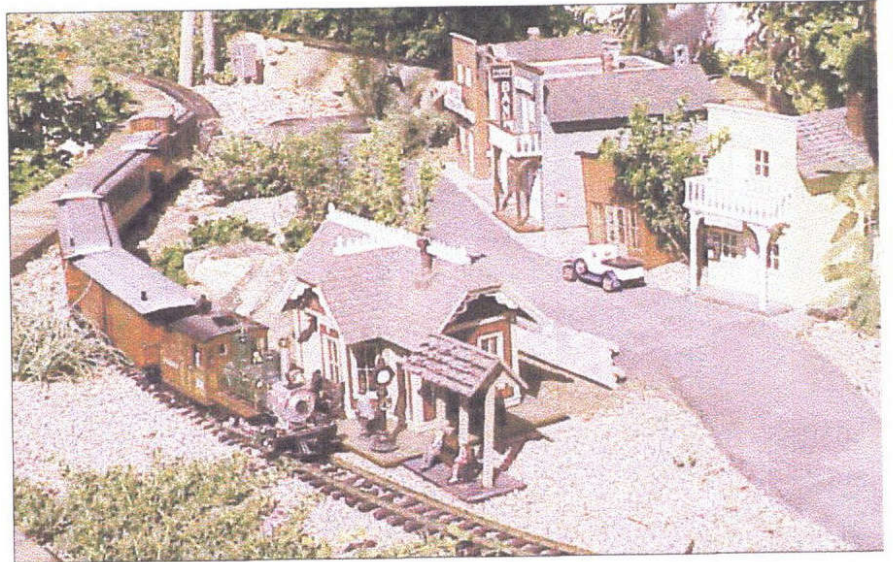

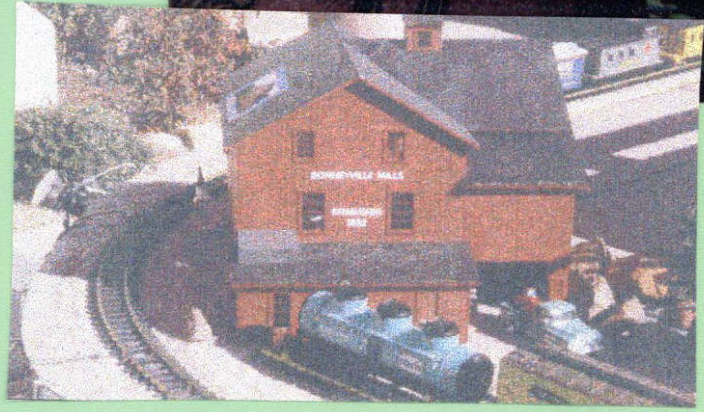
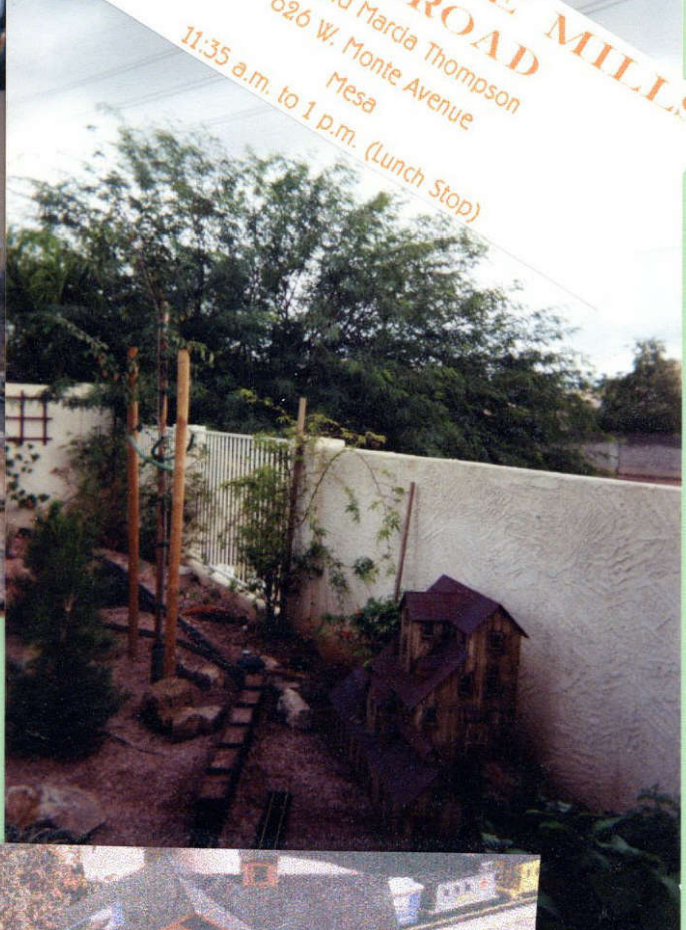
The Clearwater Railroad spans more than 320 feet of track serving the far flung towns of Fawfromit and Neartholt. Several small communities have sprung up along the right of way providing services and revenue, to farmers and railroad alike. The small community of Roundtolt is home to the recently completed Victorian style station, an essential element of passenger service for the Clearwater.

The main mine site for Wonderonlum is tucked away on a small plateau overlooking Echo Canyon. While lumbering from the nearby slopes of Shane Summit provides steady income, the tremendous size of the trees never fails to invoke comment. As the lumber comes down the mountain, the residents of Neartholt are provided endless examples of nature's bounty. Tree diameters exceeding 15' are not uncommon and the trains, of necessity, are short and well powered.

Because the owners can claim a railroad heritage, the Bonneyville Mills Railroad seemed like a natural way to perpetuate the past. Diesels are an important part of this layout which is constantly changing.

BM was established in 1834 in Bristol, Indiana, with aspirations of being a major link to the Great Lakes for northern Indiana. The railroad with which BM was to link, NYC, went to the south about 12 miles with the mainline headed for Chicago.

The motivating factor for our railroad's name was seeing a BM refrigeration car marketed by USA Trains.

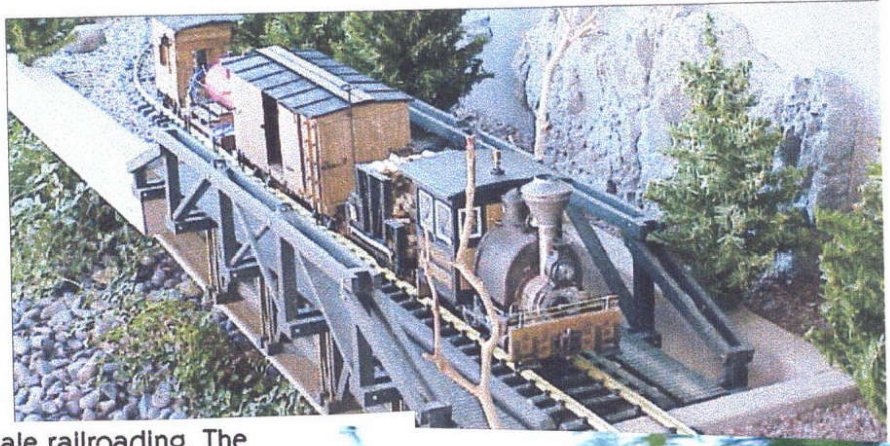

L&LP RAILROAD

The L&LP RR is our first endeavor in large scale railroading. The idea of a shelf layout was a blessing to my knees and back. Plus it kept the train from becoming Buzz, our Beagle's, most expensive toy.

The L&LP RR is set in the early 1900's. Logging and mining are the main industries of the 300-foot line. The little town of Thirsty Gulch houses both miners and loggers, which sometimes causes conflicts at the local saloon.

A scenic ride East, through the forest and down into the desert brings you into the mining town of Gecko Flats.

Although we have been working on this railroad for 6 months, there is still a lot to be completed. This being our first RR we have been, and are still, learning every step of the way.

Above all else, my wife Lynda and I love having the romance of the Old West running in our own back yard on the L&LP RR.



IRON EAGLE RAILROAD

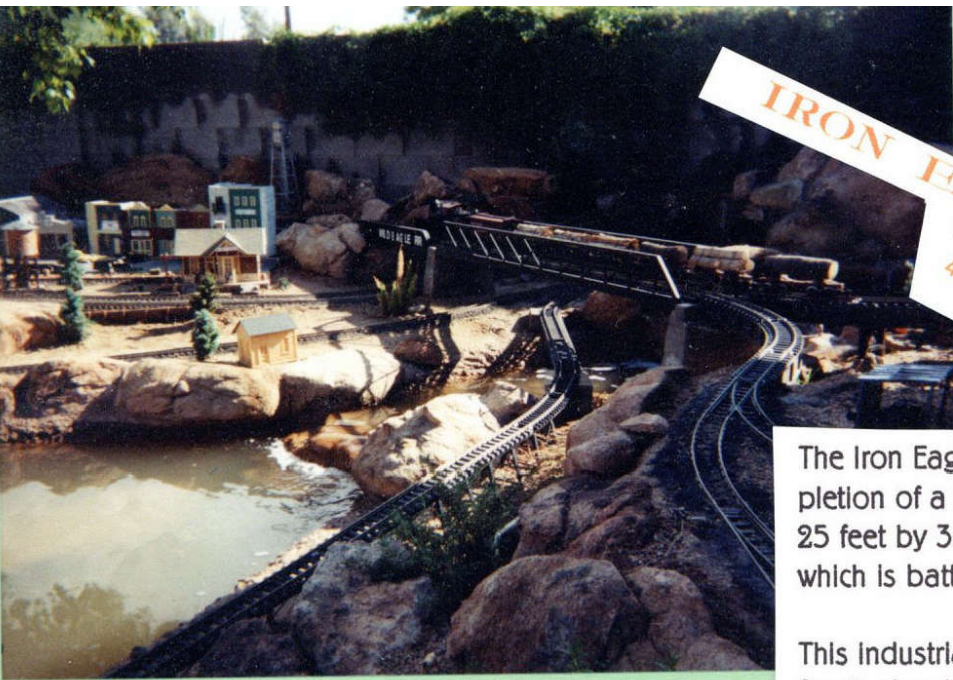

The Iron Eagle Railroad was begun in late 1997 after completion of a total home remodeling project. The layout is 25 feet by 34 feet and features a connected double track which is battery powered.

This industrial-themed line has two towns, PJ Junction and Spottsylvania, which are beautifully complimented by a three level waterfall and pond. The layout has approximately 500 feet of track, with 75 feet leading to a second layout, currently under construction.

Our home also features an 80-foot overhead train system above the patio, a 68-foot overhead train system in the master bedroom and bath, and a 155-foot overhead system in the main part of the house.

The T & M Desert Railroad has been under construction for 5 years. The layout includes about 225 feet of track; power unit and control comes from track power and Aristo-Craft Train Engineer units.

The structures are a mix of scratch-built and kit-bashed, representing a range of buildings found in rural areas and small towns along the line. The railroad serves Pixleville, a '30s style town, overlooking the main depot and the start of the journey into red-rock country. It passes a Spanish mission, a grain elevator, general stores, the territorial jail and a hacienda, then traverses scratch-built bridges and trestles, and finally runs through a long tunnel for return to the main depot.

The rolling stock is a mixture of whatever could be purchased reasonably.

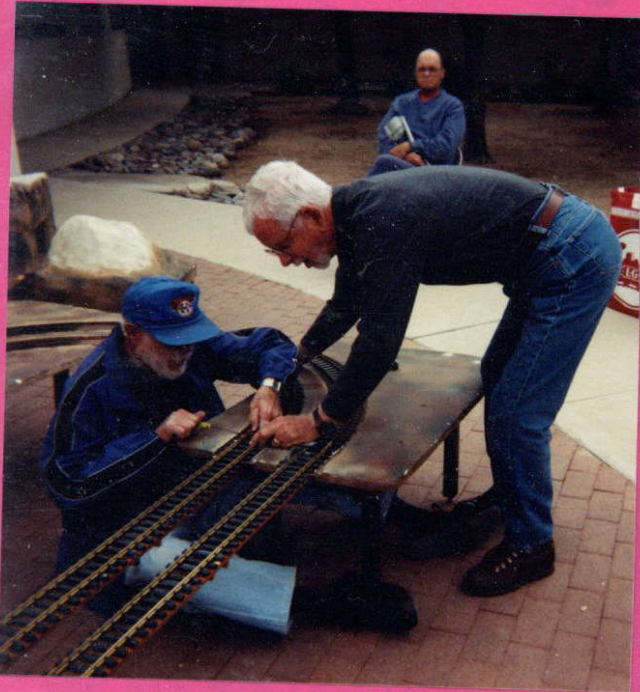
