Railroad Rants from Steve Anderson

I live in a townhouse with a small enclosed patio that has a brick surface. The patio was already brick, so the challenge was how to have a layout on brick. Rather than destroy the existing patio, I chose to put down dirt on top of the brick. My patio is 17' 9" by 14' 5". My layout is L-shaped. Using this technique I could have both a layout and a patio. The layout is approximately 5' 3" wide. One leg is 13' 10". The other is 10' 8".

I used LGB track and 1100mm radius curves. I also received some tunnel portals from Bob Dirksen that he had built for the home show. The track problem was further complicated because I had to go around an existing ivy plant.

My power supply is a Control Master 20 with power to the tracks and power from the accessory for the buildings. There was insufficient room for any sidings. Since my layout is so small I had to try and find interesting buildings and people.

The automobiles I have are from various places, like the Queen Mary Big Train Show and Target stores. Some of the

plants I have used are small enough to fit in the layout, and the ones on the brick are still in their pots. The buildings are lighted and cement board was used for streets. Building and running the layout has been a lot of fun.

(P.S. from Marty - If you have never seen this marvel you will not believe how wonderfully all of this turned out. It is great and so detailed! The LCE speed train takes those curves slick as a whistle. I love the emus on the farm!)
