The meeting was called to order by Pres. Gary Martin, who thanked the Dillons for hosting. Bill pointed out that many of his buildings are lit by solar panels, and invited everyone to come by at night to see the results.

New members and guests were introduced.

The minutes of the last meeting were approved as printed.

Gary reported a current bank balance of \$4988.00

Old Business: Dave Tiefenbach reported on the progress at Tucson Botanical Gardens. He noted the super support from our members, and thanked everyone for their help. The track is in, ballasted and glued, with about 300' of track, two trestles, and an aqueduct; Lew Sleeper and Gary are working on a water feature. There will be a training session for docents (and members who wish to attend) Nov. 21<sup>St</sup> at 10:00 a.m. We will start running Nov. 23<sup>rd</sup>. WE need plastic buildings donated for the layout, but not scratch built, because we can't guarantee the security. We will have two daily work shifts, 8:30-1 and 12:30-5. We want to have a club member at each session. Dave has sign up sheets for Emergency Calls, Stand-by List, and Take Down sign up. It was noted that we are getting lots of publicity.

Nick Buchholz reported on the NMRA and Adobe Mt. Events last week-end in Phoenix. Both were a big success, and Nick won Best Of Show at the NMRA contest!!!

Gary passed a sign up sheet for hosting meetings in 2003. There are still 4 or 5 months open. We may try to have a couple of round-a-bouts next year.
