ALL MANNER OF RAILROADING

While on vacation in Pennsylvania, Debbie and I found an area with more varied railroading per square mile than anywhere else. The town is Strasburg, and it is about 2 hours west of Philadelphia in Lancaster County. Now don't confuse this with Stroudsburg, there's some great railroading there too. At the east end of town, and all within walking distance are The Strasburg Railroad, The Railroad Museum of Pennsylvania and The Choo Choo Barn. The Railroad is a 45minute ride through Amish country with nice narration along the way. At the end of the route, the engine disconnects and makes a runaround the passenger cars and pulls you back to the start. More on this later. The Museum has a large collection of actual engines and cars. The Choo Choo Barn is famous for it's VERY action filled depiction of Amish life. In actuality, you become so enthralled with the action displays (baseball game, house fire, circus, military parade, and of course night fall) that you almost forget that there are some O-gauge trains running through the scenery. My favorite action was an exact operational duplication of the Strasburg Railroad. All automated; at each end of the line the train would stop, the cars would uncouple, the engine would run by on the side track. then back up and couple to the cars, and head off in the opposite direction. One mile down the road out of town you will find the Red Caboose Motel and Restaurant. We had lunch there and walked among 15 or so authentic 25-ton N-5 cabooses. Each

caboose has been turned into a motel room with varied room arrangements. The surprise of the day was that as we walked near the rear of the property we saw a large modern building. It is the National Toy Train Museum; and we didn't even know it was there. That was a fabulous place and would have been worth the trip to see that alone. Each gauge has a section with an operational display and shelves above with some of the finest old collectibles one could want to see. If anybody is heading to that area, we have all the brochures to guide your outing.

- 6. The treasurer's report was approved.

Editor's Report: Jim Miller reported that the newsletter is going well and he would like the club to continue to give him suggestions and articles.

Committee Reports:

Membership Committee: Ibby reported we would get new name tags after we pay our annual dues. The new roster will be out in the near future, possibility October. It will be on the website Old Business:

- **A. Non-Profit Status**: Nick reported the Non-Profit is done and has been sent with the user fee. This consisted of 50 pages. Events we that we have done and future events were listed.
- **B.** Articles of Incorporation: Norm reported that the revised and restated AOI's have been approved by the Corporation Commission and will be published in the *Daily Territorial*. We are now an official non-profit.
- **C. Revised by-Laws** are available on the website or Norm will email them to you.
- **D**. Norm and Joe Stoesser will make the presentation of the "**Thank you plaques**" to Ace Hardware and BBG. Presentation of the "**Thank you billboards**" was made by Norm to all the RITG hosts that were present at the meeting. He will be contacting the rest of the hosts to give them their billboard later.
- **E. 2008 Convention Report:** Norm reported that things are going well. He let us know that there are 2 municipal parking garages across from the hotel that we can park in for free, as there is a shortage of parking space at the hotel.
- **F. Committee Chairmen**: We are in need of a Mentor Chairmen. Janet will stay as Educational Chairmen until a new one can be found. Chuck Cook will chair the Social Committee.
- **G. New town design** will not be needed for the convention.
- I. The new bench stool is being taken care of.
- J. Torque screwdriver: Nick will look into this.
- **K. Track Voltage:** Nick will increase this at the next show.
- **L. Cross over bridge steps:** Norm has rebuilt this and George Fitzner will work on the railings.
- **M**. **2-2 ft connection** modules for the lift bridge will be made by Norm.
- N. Member survey: Norm is still looking for input from the members. He has had only 13 responses. Suggestions were made to have less events, more seminars and social activities. We will start, by every quarter having a round-a-bout with lunch at a restaurant. This will be tried at the October Round-a-bout.
