Directions to SaddleBrooke and the Forgues home

Drive north on Oracle Road (RT. 77) through the town of Catalina.

The Quail Ridge Railroad

The QRR came into existence in April of 2006, when we moved into our new home in SaddleBrooke. Rosalie and I decided that it would be easier to have an elevated railroad that would work with our landscaping plan. After two attempts at building the elevated railroad, we decided to add elevated pads and a new rock canyon to our existing landscaping. Our new plan will consist of two independent loops with a switch yard for each loop. The new layout is coming together nicely but we still have much work to do.

The layout time period will be the early 1950's to the late 1980's. When completed we will have

approximately 600 feet of track and a new water feature.







Locomotives & rolling stock are Aristo-Craft and USA Trains in 1:29 scale, along with a 2-8-8-2

Aristo-Craft Mallet modified into a 4-8-8-2 Cab Forward locomotive. Most of the buildings are mostly kits or scratch-built in 1:25 scale.

The members of the TGRS have been most helpful in providing technical information and advice in the construction of our layout.

They have 88,000 visitors a year and are expecting 90,000 for the 2007-8. The proposed loop would be elevated and one loop would go through 2 tunnel portals above existing doors. We could build scenery going behind the train and using bells at the crossing. Dick also supplied a list of pros and cons to the project. Nick made a proposal that we pursue this project and come up with a firm plan and budget then present this

to the museum. This was approved by the board.

- D. Railway Museum & Gift Shop: Norm reported we will put a back and forth trolley with sound in the Museum. The track will be on acrylic -13 ft long and 6-7 inches wide and this would be counter high at the museum. It will take 2 guys to set up.
- E. Norm thanked Lew for serving and welcomed Ruth to the Board.
- **F.** Bob Dirksen proposed a letter be sent to thank the ABTO for the opportunity of working with them.

2008 Convention DVD

The 2008 National Garden Railway Convention DVD is an excellent 3 disk set featuring 41 of the 47 railroads that were open at the convention. The only problem that I have had with the set is that the railroads are presented in a more or less random order that jumps about with no regard to location or the day on which the railroad was open. It is very difficult to relate the railroads on the disks to the descriptions in the program.

Accordingly I have prepared a chart that lists each of the railroads in the order listed in the program with a cross reference to which disk and which position on that disk the railroad is shown. For example the Lynn's <u>Tortolita Mountain Railroad</u> is number 1 in the program and can be found on Disk 2 in position (or chapter as the Disk calls it) 6.

I hope this chart will be helpful to others who purchased the DVD.
