Rails in the Garden this year was our most successful ever, thanks to the hard work of Bob Dirksen and his committee. Bob has passed the baton to Glenn Mitchell for future RITG tours, and we look forward to another successful year.

For some time, we have talked about and looked for a worthy cause in which to engage, and lo and behold, we have landed several, beginning with working on a permanent layout in the new Children's wing of University Hospital. Another long term commitment is an overhead layout at the Tucson Children's Museum, and further, a connection with the Downtown Business Alliance for their Christmastime "Festival of Lights", which might lead to a permanent layout location at some future date. One of our new members is the Tucson Botanical

- G. Projector: A motion was made to authorize purchase of a projector and cables with the cost not to exceed \$800.00. This was approved.

New Business:

- A. Tucson Children's Museum: There was discussion about electrical requirement, timing and configuration of the display. We would like Bryon Skinner and Operation Lifesaver and to work with us.
- B. TBG Steering Committee: TBG would like us to provide a 3 man steering committee for advisory purposes. Norm would like Gary to head this. Thorn Pierce will be at the meeting on Saturday to ask for donations
- C. 2009 Rails in the Garden: Tentative date is March 7&8th.
- D. Round –A-Bout with ABTO. Ibby would like to know if we are going to start this again as the convention is over.
- E. Membership: In the by-laws membership is defined as the TGRS is open to any individual 18 years or older, and their immediate family regardless of age. Everyone is eligible to vote. We need to define family membership and corporation membership and amend the by-laws. Our by-laws do not define what membership really is. This was tabled until Norm and Willis further study and define all types of memberships. TBG membership could be under Thorn Pierce as their representative until we define membership.
- F. Road trips; Norm would like to look into taking some road trips. Ken Karrels and Chuck Cook will look into this. There is the Williams train tour, Cumbre and Toltec, and Durango and Silverton.
