

5. Swap meet will be the next weekend on Saturday, January 16<sup>th</sup>.

6. Willis has ordered plaques to recognize Upland Trains and the Union Pacific. An extra one will be used by the club to place at various venues.

Newsletter Editor, Jim Miller, reported that the financial page in the last newsletter was well received. As

always he is asking for articles.

Membership Chairman, Ibby Ulmer, reported that we now have 81 paid member families which includes new members, Larry and Elizabeth Erb.
