

MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEETING of the TUCSON GARDEN RAILWAY SOCIETY February 20, 2010

The meeting was called to order by President, Norm Ulmer at 1:00 pm at the Rincon Country West RV Park recreation hall. There were approximately fifty members present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

Vice President, Willis Fagg, distributed a signup sheet for working at the County Fair in April. He also asked for a volunteer to assist him with the arrangements for the fair. He also asked for helpers at the various sites of the Rails in The Garden Tour. There will be a Toy Train Operators swap meet on June fifth for which we will have the children's layout. We are scheduled to be "chef for a day" at Ronald MacDonald House on May 8.

Treasurer, Ruth Taylor, reported the total on deposit (Checking, Savings and CD's) is \$32,195.40. Total revenues year to date are \$6,934.23 and total expenses year to date are \$3,856.29 leaving a balance of \$3,078.94. The Treasurer's report was approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

A. Nick Buccholz reported that he has painted the club's Pennsy & NYC diesel engines and is ready to install the sound systems.

B. Norm Ulmer reported that the plan for the UMC's Children's Hospital display has been finalized with the exception of the design for the mountain in the portion that runs from the gift shop into the lobby. The estimated cost will be about \$5,000.00.

C. Glenn Mitchell reported on the RITG. Contributions to the Community Food Bank will be accepted at the RITG sites. Stoessers have had to back out of the tour which leaves eight sites when you include the Tucson Botanical Garden. He distributed the packets to the hosts.

D. Pat Sumerhalder was presented a Christmas wrapped package because she earned the title of "Official Package Opener" at the Christmas party this year. Almost every package she chose was taken away by someone else prompting the making of a new rule for the Christmas Exchange. From now on no person can have more than two gifts taken from them.

NEW BUSINESS:

A. The BOD has developed a list of possible clinics to be presented and Norm asked members to check on the list those subjects that they might be interested in. We can set up those clinics on dates between general meetings.

B. Norm spoke about the need for more members to

C. The 2010 convention is coming up the end of July.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

Vice President's report: Willis discussed the need for sign ups to work at the Fair. A signup sheet will be passed at the next meeting. New chairs for the maintenance and education committees are needed.

Old Business:

UMC: Nick was asked to submit a copy of the layout to estimate costs. There was discussion of buying new rolling stock vs. using existing stock refitted with ball bearing wheels to avoid maintenance issues.

Glen Mitchell reported sales of tickets were going well for Rails in the Garden. Joe and Ellen Stoesser have had to withdraw their layout from the tour. Barry Blackwell reported that Food Bank cans will be at all houses on the tour.

New Business:

There was discussion of more emphasis on the outdoor aspects of garden railroading. Gardening clinics, nursery tours and other ideas were mentioned. It was decided that members would be asked to submit their ideas for possible topics.

The renting of possible parking space for the trailers was discussed as the Cooks have put their house on

the market. Willis was going to look into renting warehouse space and Norm has priced storage facilities which would run about \$135.00 per month.
