Directions to RCW RV Resort

Take I-19 S, go 1.3 mi to Ajo Way, exit 99. Turn Right (W) at Ajo Way, go 0.9 mi. Turn Left (S) at Mission Rd., go 0.6 mi. Turn Left at Via Ingressoentrance to Rincon Country West. Take immediate first Right at Gate House entrance. Once through gate proceed down main boulevard to club layout

located on left at end of Boulevard. There is plenty of parking on the Left in parking spaces located all around the RCW auditorium next to the train layout.

Rincon Country West Railroad

The RCW Railroad layout is the ongoing project of the RCW Garden Railroad Club located at the Rincon Country West RV Resort. The club has been developing its layout over the past five winters as most of our members are "snowbirds". We have over 900 ft. of track with four independent loops and a trolley line running from the town of Rincon to the circus. Each loop has track power. Our village of Rincon is composed of lighted, scratch built and kit built structures named for existing clubs in the RCW Park (Shuffles Boarding House, Tennis Court House, etc.). Our extensive vegetation is maintained by club members and has its own irrigation system. Our storage Train Depot contains a work bench, shelf and track storage for trains and all our electronics.

This winter club members added a waterfall and pond. A new 1940's era rural village is also being developed in the upper area of the layout.

Clinic Title: The Lincoln Train is Coming! Abraham Lincoln's 1865 Funeral Train An Adventure in 1/12 Scale Urethane Casting

Subject: Historical research and model making techniques in making the Lincoln Train

Brief Description:

In 1864 the US Military Railroad System constructed an opulent 16-wheel private car, "The United States," for President Lincoln. Strangely it was used officially only for the fourteen-day funeral trip from Washington DC to Springfield, IL with eleven elaborate open coffin funeral stops. This clinic describes the ten years of historical research and special urethane casting techniques used to build a museum quality exhibit. The trucks alone for the car have 725 scratchbuilt parts in 1" scale. A locomotive built in 1" scale, the "Nashville," complete with bunting and pictures of Lincoln was used for only a small part of the trip. Finally the elaborate hearse from Springfield, IL including a full six-horse hitch completes the model. Benedictine University in Lisle, Illinois was the project sponsor. Come and join the fun.

Brief Biography:

Wayne has been a National Model Railroad Association member and avid model builder since 1959. More than 160 articles, five books and two Kalmbach videotapes including a segment shown on "Good Morning America" are to his credit with wife, Mary Cay. Since moving to Tucson Wayne is planning a Civil War theme garden railroad. Wayne retired as a Professor of Chemistry at Benedictine University, Lisle, IL but continues to teach chemistry at the University of Arizona

MINUTES OF THE NOVEMBER TGRS BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING

January 20, 2011 at the home of Norm & Ibby Ulmer

Present were: Norm Ulmer, Ibby Ulmer, Ruth Taylor, Nick Buchholz, Gary Martin, Glenn Mitchell, Barry Blackwell, and Gina Blackwell

The minutes of the December Board of Directors meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

The Treasurer's Report was approved as read.

- 1. Total on deposit: \$33,077.01
- 2. Revenues from 11/14/10: \$1,221.87
- 3. Expenses from 11/13/10: \$2,258.33
- 4. Net revenues from 11/14/10: -\$1,736.56
- 5. Total dues paid for 2010-11: \$2,455.00

Vice-President's Report presented by Norm Ulmer: Home Show, Swap Meet and VA displays all went well. The new controllers for the children's layout worked very well at the Swap Meet. "Snap Plugs" will be added to the controller wiring for ease in assembly and take-down. Rails in the Garden (RITG) tickets and the old controllers were sold at the Swap Meet. It was noted that the RITG will now include the Gadsden Pacific Toy Train Museum. There is also a contact (Barbara Gavre) with the Tucson National Guard for RITG tickets.

Bob Conrad has agreed to coordinate the signup for the Pima County Fair volunteers.

No Editor's Report.

Committee Reports:

There were no reports from the *Clinics* or *Social Committees*.

Education: Nothing new to report.

Maintenance: Need to repair the Sumpter Valley engine (trucks & horn).

Membership Committee: There now 89 members. *Mentoring Committee* – One new person is working with Dick Izen.

Old Business:

A. There is no booster antenna for the Diamond Children's Medical Center installation as yet. A 900 MHz system is needed. Gary Martin to contact Larry Hatch in Phoenix who may have information.

> We need to re-do controls at the Tucson Botanical Gardens. We need to retrofit the Children's Museum with a battery charger – needs a new power system. Postponed until after RITG.

B. New Project Suggestions still under consideration include:

A layout in a 45' X 55' patio of the new Tucson Medical Center children's wing is a go. We can elevate the layout. The budget would be between \$7,000 and \$10,000. The layout can include tunnels and loops but we need to be aware of drainage issues.

The Southern Arizona VA Health Care System (SAVAHCS) is definitely interested in pursuing a permanent layout. The issue has been added to the February agenda of the Community Living Center (the extended care/rehabilitation wing of the hospital). Gina is to follow-up with her contact there.

- C. The two signal bridges from Eaglewings Iron Craft are not yet ready.
- D. Glenn Mitchell reported that the RITG arrangements are going very well. Tickets are being sold at ACE Hardware, Rillito Nursery, and the Arizona Transportation Museum. We are looking into providing passes for Big Brothers/Big Sisters and active military. Information about the tour has been provided to Garden Railway Magazine. The website information has been updated.

- E. Due to a work/travel conflict for Gina Blackwell, the next Board Meeting has been rescheduled to February 10th.
- F. Nick Buchholz as accepted the position of Chief Engineer.

New Business:

- A. The Children's Museum system will be retrofitted to mimic the battery-charging system at the Diamond Children's Center.
- B. Wayne Wesolowski has been approved to present his Lincoln Funeral Train reproduction project at the next general meeting. We were encouraged to invite other model railroaders from other clubs (SASME, Gadsden Pacific Toy Train) to the event.
- C. There was some discussion on membership dues and how to get more volunteers for events. Various Board members were tasked with researching certain aspects of incentives.

It was noted by Ruth Taylor that we will need to order new shirts. She will begin taking orders at the next general meeting.

There was mention of interest in a layout of the Mini-Time Museum of Miniatures – this is being explored. Discussion of a layout at the Transportation Museum has been tabled once again.

The TGRS cattlecar at the Diamond Children's Center is squeaking. This will be investigated and, if necessary, replace the trucks or the entire car.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.

TUCSON GARDEN RAILWAY SOCIETY MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEETING January 22, 2011

The meeting was called to order by the President, Norm Ulmer, at 1:00 PM. Bruce and Pat Somerhalder were thanked for hosting the meeting.

Guests present included Bob Murphy, Burt Light, Jim Walsh and Darrell McGee.

The minutes of the previous meeting (November, 2010) were approved as published in the newsletter.

There were pleas from Norm Ulmer and Willis Fagg for volunteers for the Vice President's spot on the ballot.

The Vice-President's report:

The VA and Home Show layouts had good volunteer coverage. The children's layout at the swap meet went well – there was a very large turnout for the event. We were reminded that volunteers will be needed again for June and November swap meets. The Gadsden Pacific Toy Train Museum has been added to the Rails in the Garden (RITG) tour this year. It is hoped this will produce more interaction between our two clubs.

Bob Conrad is coordinating 2 shifts per day at the Pima County Fair – we were encouraged to sign up as soon as possible. There will be parking passes and badges.

Pepe Mendoza at the Southern Arizona VA Health Care System (SAVAHCS) sent us pictures and write-ups from the Christmas layout.

The Treasurer's Report:

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The Treasurer's Report was approved as read.

Jack Forgues reported that the next clinic will be on Feb. 12th, "Weathering" given by Gary Martin from 9:00 AM to Noon. Please sign up.

The Editor (Jim Miller) asked for newsletter articles. He also encouraged the membership to use email or the website for the newsletter. Printing costs have increased due to a new printer.

There was nothing new to report from the Education Committee.

The Maintenance Committee (Gary Martin) reported that he is working on sound problems with an engine.

There have been no new requests for assistance from the Mentoring Committee.

Ibby Ulmer reported no new members.

There was no Social Committee report.

Old Business:

A. The Tucson Medical Center layout is on track. A number of buildings will be needed for the outdoor patio layout. This is in the near final planning stages. The Veterans Hospital layout is still under consideration. We may be invited to attend a planning meeting in February. B. TGRS logo cars are still available for sale at \$40 each. Some will be used in the weathering clinic to be given next month and then offered for sale.

C. The now-grounded power supplies for the children's layout are in place and work great. The old transformers were sold at the swap meet. We will now be able to set up at outdoor venues without worry of electrocution.

D. Nick Buchholz has accepted the new, non-Board position of Chief Engineer, effective July 1, 2011.

E. Glenn Mitchell reported that the Rails in the Garden 2011 tour will include nine (9) layouts, including the Gadsden Pacific Toy Train Operators Museum. ACE Hardware, Rillito Nursery, and the Arizona Transportation Museum are selling tickets. Local mailers will be going out soon - the out-ofstate mailers are gone. He issued a call for volunteers to help hosts - to be finalized at the February meeting. He asked that the hosts send Willis Fagg a list of the volunteers they know have signed up to help them. Active military and Big Brothers/Big Sisters passes are in the works. There will be collection boxes and monetary donation banks for the Community Food Bank at each layout. He also issued thanks to all of the volunteers for their help with the mailing work session.

New Business:

A. Wayne Wesolowski will present his Abraham Lincoln Funeral Train reproduction project at the February meeting. He will need a projector. It was also noted that a Vendors' Fair will be taking place in the next hall at Rincon Country West.

B. The membership was reminded of the sales going on at Tiefenbach's and Schwab's until 4 PM.

C. One club member reported the theft of trains from his truck. He will send an email with descriptions of the items lost.

Gary Martin mentioned that the weathering clinic will be with spray cans, not air brush, and he will have the necessary tools on hand. He also presented his "Boot Shop" as a Show & Tell item of something you can do in a day with scrap wood for under \$10. He is willing to help new members with projects such as this.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
