Clinic Body Mounting Kadee Couplers

On Saturday, June 11 from 9 a.m. to noon
Dick Izen will present a Tucson Garden Railway
Society clinic on how to body mount Kadee couplers
on locomotives and rolling stock. The clinic will

include a discussion of the reasons to change couplers and the benefits of body mounting as opposed to the truck mounted couplers with which most cars are sold. The clinic will cover techniques and the tools needed. Examples of 9 cars and three locomotives from seven different manufacturers will be shown. Among the examples will be two transition cars used to allow multiple types of couplers in a single train.

Body Mounting Kadee Couplers Clinic By Dick Izen

On June 11, from 9 am to about noon, at the Tucson Botanic Gardens we will have a clinic on how to body mount Kadee couplers on locomotives and rolling stock. It will include a discussion of the pros and cons of changing couplers and the benefits of body mounting as opposed to the truck mounted couplers with which most cars are sold. We will discuss the techniques and the tools needed.

Examples of nine cars and three locomotives from various different manufacturers will be displayed (see list below). The freight cars will show how to get consistent coupler height with different floor levels and construction. The locomotives will be used to demonstrate the mounting of Kadee's specially designed fully functional operating front couplers.

Among the examples of freight cars will be two transition cars used to allow multiple types of couplers in a single train. While consistent couplers are desirable, transition cars allow you to avoid the cost of having to convert all of your cars at one time. They also allow you to interoperate with other people's cars.

Please note that while you are free to handle the cars, this will be more of a show and tell clinic than a hands-on, or make and do clinic. I plan to bring the following cars and locomotives:

Clinic on Scratch Building Rolling Stock By Jack Forgues

On Saturday, May 14, 2011, fifteen members of the TGRS met at the Fairfield Recreation Center to attend a clinic on Scratch Building Rolling Stock, presented by Norm Ulmer. Each person at the clinic was given a four page outline on how to build a car from start to finish. The first thing we talk about was the type of tools and material, such as various thickness of styrene plastic sheets and shapes, different types of glues, paints needed to build and finish a freight car. Also Ozark Miniatures would be a good source for various small detail castings used for grab bars, brake wheels, nuts, bolts and washers.



We all followed along with our outlines as Norm explained in detail how to build the various components used in rolling stock such as box cars, cattle cars and reefers. Generally these are the types of cars typically found on model railroads. The next step would be to paint the car in your choice of colors. Now add the details to the car, such as push plates, corner braces, nuts, bolts, washers, brake wheels after painting the details in contrasting color. Next add decals and lettering of your choice. Finally add the couplers and trucks and you have a great car for your railroad.

I'm sure everyone enjoyed the clinic as much as I did. I want to thank Norm for putting on such great clinic on scratch building rolling stock.

Present were: Norm Ulmer, Ibby Ulmer, Willis Fagg, Ruth Taylor, Jim Miller, Nick Buchholz, Jack Forgues, Glenn Mitchell, Barry Blackwell, and Gina Blackwell The minutes of the March Board of Directors meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

The Treasurer's Report was approved as read.

- 1. Total on deposit: \$36,447.
- 2. Revenues from 03/19/11: \$1,379.
- 3. Expenses from 03/19/11: \$4,797.
- 4. Net revenues from 03/19/11: -\$3,418.
- 5. Total dues paid for 2011-12: \$120.

The Board determined that the CD that matured on 5/16 should be placed on deposit for two years to earn a better interest rate.

Vice-President's Report:

The Toy Train swap meet will be June 4th. We will need someone to pull the trailer. Bob Schwab has asked to run his circus train on the children's layout. Signup for setup, shifts and take down will be requested at the May meeting.

We will be unable to participate at the Home Show in June (6/3-6/5) due to the conflict with the swap meet.

ABTO layout tour in Phoenix will take place either on 11/12 or 11/13.

Committee Reports:

There were no reports from the Education, Maintenance or Social Committees.

Clinics: The Rainbow Ridge clinic signup for October at the Tucson Botanical Gardens is filled with a waiting list. Extension cords will be needed. Participants will be asked to bring their Dremel grinders. The first clinic will begin at 08:00 AM and the second will start at 11:30 and must end by 02:30 PM due to a wedding.

Signup sheets for the other four scheduled clinics will be available at the general meeting on Saturday.

Membership: There are currently 95 paid club families.

Mentoring: There is one request for help and Nick Buchholz has volunteered. There was some discussion about instituting a "welcome wagon" type of visitation for new members to help get them started with a layout.

In the absence of the *Social Committee* chairman, Nick mentioned that the National Train Day event was fun, the food was good, the trains were interesting, but the parking was a problem.

Old Business:

- A. The booster antenna for the Diamond Children's Medical Center installation still needs to be ordered. There is a problem with the supplier. The camera is now off. We may need to re-think the battery system.
- B. New Project Suggestions still under consideration include:

The new Tucson Medical Center children's wing layout design is in process. A number of valve boxes have been installed in the patio designated for the layout and this has made coming up with a final plan very difficult.

There has been no update from the Southern Arizona VA Health Care System (SAVAHCS) regarding a permanent layout.

- C. Election of Officers: The slate is complete. There was some discussion regarding the complex Vice President duties and the possibility of setting up a sub-committee to help.
- D. Glenn Mitchell reported that up to \$120 in parts/equipment will be needed to modify the Tucson Botanical Gardens layout controls. The second loop is running. The equipment enclosure has been purchased and needs to be installed.
- E. The modification of the Children's Museum layout is on track for completion soon.
- F. The switching module layout is nearing completion needs ballast.

New Business:

Nick presented a list of suggestions for module equipment, improvements, and additions. It has been proposed that we find a venue large enough (the Expo Center?) to serve as a workshop where club members could work in teams to repair and update the modules. There was some discussion about selling lots on the town modules to try and get more members interested in the project. We will also look into purchasing another large trailer as the medium-sized one is not very practical for our needs.

Dick Izen has been authorized to purchase a folding pavilion for use at outdoor events.

The Board decided to purchase Bob Schwab's circus train (eleven cars plus engines) for \$1000.

This could be used in part or whole on the TMC layout and/or the children's layout.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.
