Volunteer Vests
And Recognition Pins

Criteria -

Vests and pins will be awarded to those members, as approved by the Board of Directors, for consistent service at Society functions, since 1995, including Swap Meets, Home Shows, County Fairs, Convention service, Civic Functions, Clinic conductor, or as a Society officer, director or committee chairperson.. No person shall be awarded more than one vest, regardless of total work shifts served. For those members who have opened their layouts for Rails in the Garden, a special patch will be awarded in addition to a vest. Past Presidents will be awarded vests with gold "Conductor" pins. All other pin awards will be silver. Past Vice Presidents will be awarded "Engineer" pins. Past Secretaries, Treasurers, Newsletter Editors and Committee Chairmen will be awarded "Fireman" pins.

REV 1 Should any member choose to forego the award of a vest and instead opt to use their own Convention vest, they will be awarded a silver Conductor pin in lieu of a vest.

Officers, members of the Board and committee chairs will earn shift credits as follows: President and Vice President will earn three shift credits per meeting attended, up to ten meetings per year; Secretary, Treasurer, Newsletter Editor and Committee Chairmen, two shift credits per meeting attended up to ten meetings per year; At-Large members of the Board, one shift credit per meeting attended, up to ten meetings per year.

For Future Performance -

Effective 1 January, 2012 -

Any member who volunteers and serves 50 shifts of work, either at a function set-up, running trains or manning the Society Table, or as specified in the "Criteria" section above, shall qualify for the award of a vest with Society patch. Further, in recognition of additional service, any member who

volunteers and serves additional shifts of work shall be eligible for the award of a pin denoting this service - "Switchman" for 10 shifts, "Brakeman" for 20 shifts, (i.e., 10 shifts more than "Switchman") "Fireman" for 30 shifts, "Engineer" for 40 shifts and "Conductor" for 50 shifts.
