TGRS General Meeting Minutes October 18, 2014

Meeting was called to order by President Gary Martin Gary thanked our hosts John and Audrie Fennema for opening their house to our meeting as they are new members.

Gary also gave a special thanks to John and Phillip for their open house on Oct. 4th.

Minutes from the September 13th meeting were approved as posted.

Treasurer Ruth Taylor reported revenues since 9/13/14 were \$1,355 and expenses were \$1,312, leaving a gain of \$43. Year to date 2014/2015 revenues are \$2,914, expenses are \$3,075 leaving a deficit of \$161. Total dues paid are \$2,400, ten members have not paid.

Vice President reported on dates coming up. November 6th is the board meeting, November 8th the open house and meeting at Gary Martin's, Christmas luncheon is on December 6th and will cost \$11 per person.

VA set up is Dec. 26th, trains run 29th, 30th and 31st with teardown on the 31st. Volunteers are still needed.

ABTO is November 1st. Richie's Walk is November 7th. Gadsen Pacific Swap Meet is Nov. 14th and 15th.

We have been asked to do the Home show Jan. 9th, 10th and 11th which conflicts with the Jan. Gadsen Swap meet. It was decided that we would have enough volunteers to do both events. The board may pick up the parking at the TCC. Trailers for that would have to go in on the 7th. Partial teardown would be on the 11th.

Nick Buchholz would appreciate articles for the news letter by the 24th as he will be out of town.

Under clinics, Nick will be holding one after the meeting on batteries. Glenn Mitchell will be holding a short clinic during the day at Gary Martin's.

Offsite projects Gary reported the TBG has a secondary 5 amp transformer and new timing system.

TGRS Board Meeting Minutes Thursday, October 9, 2014

Meeting was called to order by President Gary Martin. Gary thanked RITG committee members for attending their meeting. The Martins for having the board and Norm for bringing cookies.

September board meeting minutes were not available and will be submitted with October's minutes.

Ruth Taylor reported a checking account balance as of 10/9/14 of \$10,576, savings account balance of \$17,228 for a total of \$27,804. Revenues from 9/13/14 were \$970 expenses were \$1,312 for a draw of \$342. Year to date recap for 2014/15, revenues \$2,530, expenses \$3,075 for a draw of \$546. Total dues paid 2013/14 were \$2,505, total dues paid 2014/15 \$2040. 21 members are unpaid.

Vice President Willis Fagg reported on upcoming meetings. October 18th is the general meeting at the Fennen's; Nov. 6th is the board meeting; Nov. 8th is Gary Martin's open house, club meeting and invitational dinner; ABTO is touring Nov. 1st; Richie's Walk is Nov. 7th; Gadsden Swap Meet is Nov. 14th and 15th: The Christmas party is Dec. 6th; board will meet the 4th; the VA hospital setup is Dec. 26th with the layout open the 29th and 30th; the home show is Jan. 9th and 10th. The

home show and the Jan. swap meet may conflict. Discussion was that if the general membership agrees we will do both.

Nick Buchholtz reported newsletter was going well, but needs more info. For some reason he did not receive last months board minutes.

Under committee reports Nick will put together a clinic on battery technology.

Under maintenance Gary reported that Tucson Botanical Garden now has a new transformer and two working relays. Glen Mitchell reported that UMC is working fine. He also reported that at TCM he replaced two relays and reassembled start switch.

Membership, Jerry Tulino stated we had 95 members with 18 unpaid as of today.

Nick reported we have one person asking to be mentored.

Chuck Cook reported that the social luncheon at the Red Garter was a success. The next meeting will be Nov. 19th and may be at a different location. More to come on that.

Under old business Chuck reported that we are all set, however still need helpers.

Richie's Walk on Friday, Nov. 7th at Flowing Wells will need four to five people helping. There will be a sign up sheet at the meeting.

Janet Mitchell has taken the lead on the RITG. Gary thanked her for that. RITG will be greatly simplified. The only donations that will be taken will be for the food bank. Deadline for volunteers to show their layouts is Dec. 1st.

Off site projects Gary reported that the Rodeo Museum needs electronics installed.

Under the Awards Program Norm Ullmer reported that everything is ready for the Dec, Christmas luncheon.

TBG Sunset Saturdays went well. Gary said he will discuss the luminaries at a later date. He did say that it was a good way to get exposure.

Under other business Gary announced that we still had some rolling stock from the Bob Schwab purchase. Elections are coming up and we need an election chairperson. Ruth Taylor went over next year's budget and the board modified then passed it. It will be presented at the general meeting.

China Trip April 22nd – May 7th Part 3

Here I am again, writing about our train travels in China. In past articles, I have written about the eight minute ride on the ultra-modern Shanghai Magiev train. Second train we rode went from Shanghai to Beijing on the Jinghu High Speed Railway. The five hour trip was on another modern comfortable train.

Third train we took was an 11 hour, overnighter from Beijing to Xian on April 28th. (697 miles) *"The Z19 is the fastest and most modern long distance trains in China"*. I took this from the internet.

We slept four to a room in tight quarters, (bunk beds) in what is called a soft sleeper. If you want to rough it, look up hard sleeper. Z stands for "Zhinda" in Chinese or "Direct Express". This trip was pretty uneventful. The train was older but clean and served its purpose. Seems like we got on the train in Beijing, got into our bunks, woke up and we were in Xian.

The amazing walled city of Xian with the Terracotta soldiers, and Wild Goose Pagoda, is a city that has retained its ancient charm. The Terracotta soldiers were one of the high lights of the trip but there were many.

On to Part 4, a train trip none of us will forget!!
