# TGRS GENERAL MEETING February 14, 2015

This month's meeting will be on the 14th of February at 1:00 PM at Rincon Country West RV Resort. Trains will be running from noon until 1 pm. The meeting will be held in the Recreation Hall adjoining the Auditorium. This building is next to the club train layout.

#### **Directions to RCW RV Resort**

Take I-19 S, go 1.3 mi to Ajo Way, exit 99. Turn Right (W) onto Ajo Way and go 0.9 mi. Turn left (S) at Mission Rd., go 0.6 mi. Turn left at Via Ingresso (first traffic light). Take immediate first Right at Gate House entrance to Rincon Country West RV Resort. Once through gate proceed down main boulevard to club layout located on left at end of Boulevard. There is plenty of parking on the left in parking spaces located all around the RCW auditorium next to the train layout.

#### **Rincon Country West Railroad**

The RCW Railroad is the ongoing project of the RCW Garden Railroad Club located at the Rincon Country West RV resort. The club has been developing its layout over the past eight winters as most of our members are "snowbirds". We have over 1000 ft. of track with five independent loops and two trolley lines. One fully

automated trolley line runs three trolleys simultaneously. Throughout the winter months we run over twenty five different locomotives on a posted schedule for the viewing pleasure of



park residents and club members. Our Village of Rincon is composed of lighted, scratch built and kit built structures named for existing clubs in the RCW Park (Shuffles Boarding House, Tennis Court House, etc.). Our extensive vegetation is maintained by club members and has its own irrigation system. Our storage Train Depot (built by club members) contains a work bench, shelf and track storage for trains and all our electronics.

Our recent expansion has added another 150 ft. of track and a fifth independent loop allowing more members to run their trains. The layout also has two water features and push button activated farm and circus sounds as well as 50's music from the country diner. A 1940's era village continues to be developed in the upper

area of the layout.

# CHINA TRIP April 22<sup>nd</sup> – May 7<sup>th</sup> Part 4

Our final train trip in China was a 24hour adventure from Xining, China to Lhasa, Tibet. April 30, 2014 was a day of travel. We left Xian by plane and flew to Xining, had lunch in town which consisted of yak meat, rice and vegetables.



We boarded our train K9801 at 3:05. It was very similar to the last train we rode. Not modern by our standards but clean and meet our needs. Once again we were in bunks or sleeper berths, considered first class. The operational speed was about 120km/h. This is the highest railway in the world and is built for the high altitude environment, equipped with air-conditioning, and an oxygen supply. In our room we could hear bursts of oxygen being blown into our sleeping quarters.



Tanggula Station is the highest railway station in

the world and the highest point we reach was 16,640 feet.



This part of the journey was an experience. I went down to the dining room and could see how the food was prepared and stored. We ate snacks and had bottled water that we had brought with us. We all go a little claustrophobic after 24 hours but that was part of the adventure and well worth the trip to Tibet.

Lhasa, Tibet the land of the Dalai Lama, the Potala Palace, Jukhang Temple, Drepung Monastery and so much more. Lhasa is about 12,000 feet above sea level and has 68% of the air at sea level. Most of us climbed the 243 steps to the top of the Potola Palace which has more than 1,000 rooms, and 10,000 shrines. I loved this little city. Instead of adding a picture of the train which I only have one of, I have pictures of people to share with you.
