## JUNE 11, 2015

Meeting was called to order by President Gary Martin. Board Meeting Minutes for May 7, 2015 were approved as posted.

Gary Martin reported on the treasury as submitted by Ruth Taylor: Checking account balance is \$9,235; savings is \$17,230 for a total on deposit of \$26,465. Revenues since 5/8/15 are \$245; expenditures are \$1,498 for a deficit of \$1,253. Year to date 2014/2015 Revenues are \$8,307; expenses \$11,444. Willis Fagg suggested we send out an e-mail reminding members that their dues need to be in now and can be paid at the June meeting.

### JUNE 20, 2015

Meeting was called to order by President Gary Martin. Gary thanked the hosts, Bruce and Pat Somerhalder. He then reminded the club this was his last meeting as President. Guest and new member JP Berbine from Vail was introduced. Minutes from the May 9, 2015 general meeting were approved as submitted. Treasurer Ruth Taylor gave the treasurer's report. Total on deposit is \$26,465, \$9,235 in checking and \$17,230 in savings. Revenues from 5/8/15, expenses \$1,498 leaving a draw of \$1,263. Year to date 2014/15 revenues, \$837, expenses \$11,444 for a draw \$3,137. Dues paid 2014/15 \$2,475; 2015/16 \$570. Α complete breakdown for all treasurer's reports are on file with the secretary.
