

#### General Meeting June 11, 2016

The meeting was called to order by the President, Glenn Mitchell at 10 AM at Willis and Dottie Fagg's home.



They were thanked for hosting and for the refreshments provided. There were 27 attendees present.



There were no guests or new members.

The minutes of the May meeting were approved as published.

Ruth Taylor presented the Treasurer's Report: Total on deposit, \$25,303; Revenues from 05/14/16, \$445 and there were no expenses reported. The 2015/16 year-to-date recap: Revenues: \$7,362; expenses \$7,139 (net revenue \$223). Dues paid for 2016/17: \$240.

Vice-President's Report (Willis Fagg):

- The next general meeting will be September 24 at the Forgues home to be preceded by the Board meeting on 09/08 at the Martins. All other meeting locations, dates and times can be found on the Calendar of Events on the TGRS website.
- The June Swap Meet went well. He reminded those volunteering to help with the Summer Christmas event at the Diamond Children's Center that the start time is 09:30 am. The upcoming Social events will be June 16 and July 21 at the Red Garter. The trip to the Diamondbacks game is slated for October 2 with the possibility of a bus available from Tucson. More information will follow. Future Swap Meets are scheduled for November 11-12 and January 13-14. The VA hospital display is slated for December 26 (set-up) through 12/30. The ABTO tour is tentatively set for March 11 (Tucson). Willis has also set up a planning meeting with Julia for the next Pima County Fair. There are some issues under discussion (i.e. staffing) concerning whether TGRS will be able to participate in the January Home Show.

Committee Reports:

- Membership is holding at 78.
- The Website is doing very well with no issues.
- The Vice President covered the upcoming social events in his report.

Old Business:

- Tucson Children's Museum a lantern has been added; updating is in progress.
- Rodeo Parade Museum working to fill in open space with cactus; Gary Martin is working on a station.

- Diamond Children's Center coupler has been replaced; otherwise doing OK.
- Tucson Botanical Gardens there are the usual maintenance issues. Bob and Jackie Conrad have become the primary caretakers and are very much appreciated for it. Gary stated that there is always a lot of seasonal debris to be removed and that the layout needs re-ballasting. He is encouraging members to "adopt a building" if possible. Stop by and choose one to take home for repair, repainting, etc.
- Trolley re-hab is badly needed on the modular layout. There will be future discussion (via email?) regarding this and other pending layout issues.

New Business:

• Willis and Dottie had a display of the railroad cars their grandsons made (with a little help) as a surprise for their 50<sup>th</sup> Wedding Anniversary.



- Some suggestions were made regarding possible future social outings: they included group tours of the Franklin Automobile Museum, the Mini Time Machine Museum, and the Rodeo Parade Museum.
- Rails in the Garden 2017 needs a chairperson.
- It has been requested that the boxes with club registration sheets, general club information, etc. be placed in the small trailer with the children's layout.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:37, but was followed by Dr. Ellyn Biggs of Little Bit's.

**BELT LINE:** A railroad with trackage within and/or around a city, operating as a pickup, delivery, and transfer facility for truck lines and industrial plants.

Now 'belt line' can refer to roads, trails, and even neighborhoods, e.g., Oregon Route 569, The Belt Line Road (around Dallas), BeltLine Atlanta, or Beltline Calgary (a neighborhood).

When David and I visited Sydney, Australia in 1986, we took this cog railway and had a great time. I'm glad to see it's still there and operational.

It's the steepest railway in the world (Guinness Book of Records), and originally part of the Katoomba mining tramways constructed between 1878 and 1900.

The funicular railway line descends through sandstone cliffs, via a rock tunnel beside Orphan Rock, then emerges to spectacular views and lush fern-filled rainforest.
