**Directions:** Easiest way to get there is travel north on Oracle and turn east on Eagle Crest Drive on the north end of Catalina. Take your first right on to Edwin and head east about a half mile and you will see an open gate into the Saddlebrook area on your left. You will be on Clubhouse. Take your first left on Sandcrest and follow it up the hill to where it intersects with Amberwood. We'll have the cross buck sign out. Find a spot to park in on the street and wander toward the back yard.

Bring your folding chair as our chairs are limited in number.

## Guiness World Record for Longest Chocolate Structure

A train made entirely of chocolate has set a new Guinness World Record as the longest chocolate structure in the world (2012).



The sculpture, on display at the busy Brussels South station, is 112-feet (34.05 meters) long and weighs over 2,755 pounds (1250 kilos). Maltese chocolate artist Andrew Farrugia spent over 700 hours constructing the masterpiece.



He said he came up with the idea of the train last year after visiting the Belgian Chocolate Festival in Bruge: "I had this idea for a while, and I said what do you think if we do this realization of a long chocolate train, you know, because a train you can make it as long as you like.



"Actually, it was going to be much smaller than it was, but I kept on adding another wagon, and it's the size it is today."



After measuring the length of the train and confirming no material other than chocolate was used, officials from the Guinness Book of World Records added a new category to the collection of world records and declared the train to be the longest chocolate structure in the world.
