The Railroad (circa 2005)

The Rock Bottom Railroad is a multi-year work (4 year in 2005) in progress. There are about 300 feet of main line with a 40-foot mining loop and an 80-foot point to point trolley line. The layout includes a waterfall, a stream and a 12-foot double track tunnel shared by the main and trolley lines.

The name, Rock Bottom, describes both the terrain and the financial condition of the railroad. The builder is a lover of puns and has incorporated several into the layout.

Port of Tucson Tour

On Tuesday, February 9th about 20 TGRS members took a guided tour (arranged by Chuck Cook) of the Port of Tucson which is located off Kolb between I-10 and Valencia. Our tour guide was Mike Levin, Executive VP, Marketing, and son of the founder.



Mike explained the port is a full service inland port, rail yard and intermodal facility linking California and Texas. The Port of Tucson is Arizona and Sonora Mexico's International Inland port, served by rail from the ports of Long Beach and Los Angeles up to 5 days per week.

By shipping international containers by rail to Southern Arizona and reducing short-distance transfers, the Port of Tucson reduces the cost of international freight to the region



They own 3 engines for moving stock and 10 miles of their own track, as well as container forklifts for ease of loading and off-loading containers from rail cars and truck tractors.



After the tour, Dennis Mahar arranged a group lunch at <u>Cattletown Steakhouse and Saloon</u>, and you can see we were welcomed with our name on the marquee...a nice time!

Minutes of the January meeting were approved as read. Jerry Tulino requested a clarification regarding the wording about the Ronald McDonald House Luncheon. We will be providing lunch for the people staying there.

Treasurer Ruth Taylor Reported that the checking account balance as of 2/9/17 was \$7593 and the savings account balance was \$17,246, for a total on deposit of \$24,839. There were no receipts from 1/12/17 and expenses were \$497, for a total of (\$497.) Year to date recap: receipts \$1,822, expenses \$2,375, for a total net revenue of (\$553.)

Vice President's report: Fair setup will begin on April 6 with modules and track only. April 7 will be for populating the layout with buildings, figures, and other decorative items. We will begin teardown after closing of the fair on April 30 by removing all buildings, figures, and other decorations. Final teardown of the modules will depend upon when 4H will vacate the building so we can get our trailers in. We still need many more volunteers to sign up to work shifts at the fair. Willis needs signups by the first week in March so he can have tickets to distribute at the March meeting.
