TGRS General Meeting Minutes Saturday, June 17, 2017 at 10:00 a.m.

The meeting was called to order by President Glenn Mitchell who thanked Willis and Dottie Fagg for hosting the meeting at the last minute.



There were no corrections or comments to the minutes of the May general meeting.

Treasurer Ruth Taylor Reported that the checking account balance as of 6/15/17 was \$4,421 and the savings account balance was \$17,273, for a total on deposit of \$21,694. Receipts from 5/21/17 were \$123 and expenses were \$2826, for a total of (\$2,703.) Year to date recap: receipts \$5,143, expenses \$8,841, for a total net revenue of (\$3,698.)

Dennis Mahar has been contacted by KVOA wanting to do an interview about the club and a video of a layout. He and Willis decided that John Charmichael's layout would be a good one to feature in the article. Willis and Dennis worked on an outline of things we wanted emphasized in the article, including history, mission, and community involvement. Ruth put together some figures: Since 2008 we have spent over \$38,000 on public layouts and donated over \$7,000 to the food bank. We hope this will provide publicity for future events.
