


New Location

Willis and Dottie Fagg have offered their home for the September meeting if we cannot get an indoor venue (e.g., the Botanical Gardens). Date to be determined.

The Mitchells will host the October meeting on the 19th. Janet advised that we check for the latest traffic alerts prior to heading out due to the planned I-10 interchange construction. Also check the October Newsletter for construction updates.

The Leukemia Society's Light the Night event is scheduled for October 26 in the East side parking lot of Park Place Mall.

The November meeting will be at the Martins' and the February meeting at Rincon Country West. We are still looking for hosts/venues for other meetings.

Claudia Nelson will be taking over as Vice-President as of July 1. Please contact her after that date with any changes or updates to upcoming events.

Old Business:

The 2 large trailers are now stored at the Pima County Fairgrounds and the small trailer is stored at the Blackwell home. This new arrangement for the trailers will save the club more than \$1,000/year. Also, Dennis Maher has made some additional legs for the modular layout for increased stability.

Gary Martin and John Fennema have been working on the layout at the Tucson Botanical Gardens every Tuesday morning (beginning around 7am until about 10) re-working the roadbed and general clean up. This is a very visible advertisement for our club and it is important to keep the trains running and the layout clean and presentable. The 2019 National Garden Railway Convention will be held August 27-31, 2019 in Portland, Oregon. The convention will be held at the Double Tree Hotel in downtown Portland. With easy access to freeways and the MAX light rail, the centrally located Double Tree offers top-rate accommodations for the best convention experience. On-line website registration will open on August 30, 2018. We will offer a short ride behind the SP Daylight 4449 steam engine to our BBQ at Oaks Park on the Willamette River. We will be selling 18 one-way cab rides in 4449 for the short, two mile ride. Cab rides will sell out quickly, so plan to register early.

The convention has been moved to the last week in August, so there is no longer a conflict with the National Narrow Gauge Convention in Sacramento being held the first week in September, 2019. We are working with the planners of the NNGC, and some layouts in their pre-convention tour are expected to be included in our post-convention tour.
