

Bert & Jane Wight joined TGRS since the last club meeting. Bert was present. Klaus Pietrczak attended as a guest of Thomas Preisner

Club treasurer report – Claudia Nelson reporting for Margaret Torres Nelson

• All Acct Balance \$ 20,304.16 YTD Income (since July 1) \$ 710.00 YTD Expense \$ 234.40

• 56 members, 6 of whom are honorary. 40 have paid dues for the coming year

Newsletter report – Claudia Nelson

• Still encourages members to write articles about their trains and travels.

Webmaster report – Jerry Tulino

• Still working

Vice President report – John Fennema,

• NGRC report – Bob Northington of Prescott Model RR Club hopes to start a G gauge group. He probed about TGRS supporting a 2028 convention to be held in Arizona. The club voted that this is too big a project for our current group to support.

• Ocotillo Learning Center – Plan to display the children's layout (running battery) planned for Dec 21st. A sign-up genius will be circulated for 4-6 people (min) to staff this.

• Light-the-night event – The board feels this event is not a good fit for rail enthusiasm or member recruitment. If a group of 4 or more can arrange, we'd be happy for you to take the children's layout.

• Pima County Fair – Tom Fagan has indicated he can recruit workers thru Boy Scouts of America Troop 157 while offering the RR merit badge to the scouts. We hope to get them to help with setting up the layout and running it on a weekend. They have to "build something" for the merit badge and Tom/John suggested they might build a module for the fair layout with a Boy Scout Jamboree suggested.

• Coordinate "some involvement" with Gadsden thru Craig Anderson. Form a committee to see if there's places we can interact – as a possible source of members for TGRS. Some members have expressed misgivings about the level of involvement this would entail.

• Gadsden Pacific swap meet is scheduled for Nov 12. We have 2 tables, and expect to set up the children's layout, running on batteries. We hope to sell some of the things from our shed. A sign up will be open for members to support the display.

Membership

• The club approved a plan to give a free year membership in TGRS for anyone who applies at the RITG and Pima County fair.

• The club will move to sending the "new member package" thru email rather than distribute paper handbook.

• Suggestion to approach Old Tucson about building a garden train display at their facility.

• Suggestion to contact sales companies at Train-Li, Bachmann, and Piko to get a list of people who buy G scale trains in southern Arizona. This task has been delegated to Thomas Preisner.

Public displays report - Charlie Weesner

• Dave, the railroad guy at Tucson Children's Museum, has retired. This will drive more visits for minor maintenance in the future.

• TBG layout shut down for the monsoon. It's back running, now, with 6-8 button-presses per day – down from 40-50 in the spring.

New business

• Club plans to assemble a "media presentation" center with a 32" TV and protective carrying case. Marvin Clark indicated he has a TV to give away.

- We think we should plan a work session to repair & upgrade the modular layout sections for the fair.
- Contacted Rillito Nursery (Orange Grove & La Cholla) to see about interactions clinic on RRappropriate plants, maybe a weekend setup of temporary display in their sales area?

• Consider presenting a session at the fair demonstrating some part of garden RR as a hobby. • Electronic programming for functions and sound? • How to start with an inexpensive train set?

- Reach out to PTO's for school out-reach and chances to promote model trains?
- ABTO is participating at McCormick-Stillman RR Park on Sept 30-Oct 1 for "Railfan Days"

• Suggestion to apply for a "club discount" at one or more retail operators. Preisner suggests Black Forest (https://www.blackforesthobby.com/trains/) which sells hobby supplies over the internet from Scottsdale.
