Summer is upon us which means it is too hot to play outdoors. However, there are alternatives.

#### Gn15

This is G-Scale running on HO track. It has been around since the Mid 1990's. Indoor use only recommended. See also: <u>Gn15 - Wikipedia</u>

#### GNine

Gnine is G-Scale but runs on N-Gauge track. Again, only for indoor use. It has been around for as long as Gn15, but the only manufacturer basically went out of business. However, if you are handy you can easily kitbash locos and cars for little money using existing N-Gauge products.

#### Faller eTrain

Gebr. Faller Germany owns POLA whom we all know.Their eTrain started out as Hit Train in O Gauge with plastic track and battery operated locos.

Eventually it progressed to track powered locos and brass track which looks just like LGB track, only smaller because it is 32 MM - O Gauge track. The eTrain is approx. 1:32 scale.

It can easily be found on <u>www.ebay.com</u> or with a much bigger variety in Germany on <u>www.ebay.de</u>

All eTrain products were made in Germany sometime in the 1980's and are robust yet cheap. The eTrain can be used outdoors, but I am not sure whether it can withstand the Arizona sun. Best to use it indoors.

The beauty of all 3 scales is that one can use existing cars, trucks, trees, figures structures etc., as they will supplement each of the 3 scales.
