I did start to paint a NW2 cow and calf unit into Southern, The units are masked and awaiting the white for the lower stripe. But the basement is like an icebox and hopefully with warmer weather on the way, I can paint the white next week as the units are already in black and the decals are printed. In the beginning of January, I did make a chapel car for a pastor friend with a complete interior using a Bachmann combine. The text on the car lists the places he has pastored in the last 62 years. His son is our Pastor.

I have not done anything thing else on the On30 as I am awaiting another Number 1 kit to get the windows for my structure that was a shoe factory. In the 1970's, the folks who worked in the structure made furniture.

Bar Mills in 2005 decided to build a recreated station of a Maine narrow gauge railroad and moved

the business inside the station. Bar Mills has on their website has a very interesting tour of their

I know many of the members of the club are into other scales such as N, HO, and O. Bar Mills makes

nice kits for those scale. Their kits do take time, but the result is very nice.

I took the HO Babcock Boiler Kit and built the kit during the Christmas break as a Christmas

present for Larry Brown. I changed the name of the business from Babcock Boiler to Babcock Lumber

which was a business in St Marys. The main thing with their kits is reading their instruction sheets

carefully and following their suggestions as the kits are laser cut wood. They tell you in every kit to

prime the wood with light cheap gray spray paint so the wood does not warp before painting it with

cheap craft paints that you can get in Walmart or craft stores. I use all the parts in the kit, but I made my own roofing.

I found HO people at Hobby Lobby. Hobby Lobby also sells O scale folks which I have bought for

the On30 layout. If you don't like the clothes colors, take a brush and in a few moments, you can change their appearance so they don't look like every one Hobby Lobby sells. I glued the structure to some foam board.

USA Trains Tank Car Are Coming Back

In a few weeks USA will get in another run of the 42 foot and 55 foot tank cars which are lettered in

most of the original company names.

Road names are for the 42 foot cars: UTLX, Hooker, Englehard, Airco, Safety Kleen, ADM, Procor,

BNSF, UP, and Sunoco.

Road names for the 55 foot cars are almost the same except no Safety Kleen, but with addition of

Dupont and US Rail Leasing.

The cars, as before, will be made of aluminum with metal trucks and couplers. I like the looks of the

cars especially the 42 foot tank cars, but they are not happy running through my switches. I only have

one 42 ft car, but I do have 4 of the 29 foot cars. The 29 ft car can carry very heavy liquids. The 42 and

55 foot cars can carry all kinds of chemicals.

If you like a varied collection of freight cars for your garden railroad, get a copy of American Car & Foundry Company 1869-1999 by Edward Kaminski published by Signature Press, 1999

I bought my copy when it came out. It is a comprehensive book of the history of freight cars in 362 pages built by the American Car & Foundry. One of their main plants is located in Milton, PA where they build tank cars. They have other plants where they build covered hoppers and other kinds of freight cars.

The book starts the history of the company. The first major car produced by ACF was the tank car and the book shows early tanks cars made from 1865 up to the modern funnel flow cars. ACF was and is one of the main producer of tank cars.

The chapters in the book include:

39 pages on the history of the company including showing how tank cars are built

115 pages on tank cars

51 pages on house cars (box, reefer & stock),

10 pages on flat cars,

22 pages on open top hoppers and gondolas,

58 pages on covered hoppers

23 pages on passenger cars

17 on cabooses, snow plows, etc

The last few pages have drawings and specifications about tank cars

The book has 1260 b & w and color photos.

If you are buying any of USA tank cars, you can check them against the photos in the book
